Relative to discipline of students, addressing students' behavioral needs. Passed in the House on 1/8/2020

## House Bill 1707FN

Expanding FCESS program to children under age 3 who are born substance-exposed (NAS or FASD). Passed in the House on 2/19/20

## House Bill 1473

Requiring schools to have a special education parent advisory council (SEPAC). Passed in the House on 3/12/20

### House Bill 1659FN

Relative to patient directed care and patient's rights with regard to end-of-life decisions. Referred to Interim Study 3/4/20
